On May 26, U.S. Reps. Judy Chu (D-CA), Judy Biggert (R-IL), Mike Coffman (R-CO), and Dana Rohrabacher (R-CA) introduced [House Resolution 282](#). The resolution expresses regret for the passage of discriminatory laws that restricted the civil rights of Chinese immigrants and reaffirms Congress's commitment to protecting the civil rights of all people, regardless of race, and ethnicity.
